Dear Superintendent Malik and Regional Board Members,

This letter is a recommendation from the LSAB in the Akiak community. We are writing to you, the Regional School board because we want what is best for our students in Akiak and we feel that approval of this recommendation will improve the quality of education in the Akiak community. Based on current enrollment of 126, we are recommending an additional elementary teacher.

The effect of overcrowded classrooms impacts the school in the following ways;

- Our classrooms are small in comparison to the other two schools, causing desks, and students to be cramped in confining spaces. A lack of floor space prohibits positive transitions and traffic flow between activities.
- 2. In the elementary grades some classrooms have 25 students.
- 3. All elementary grades are combined; K-1, 2-3, 4-5, 6-7
- 4. Kindergarten and first grade need to be separated. As does the combination class 3-4-5 which were grouped according to student ability levels. Throughout the building our students vary in ability levels in both Reading and Math.
- 5. The variance in ability levels make it difficult to meet the needs of all students by 1 teacher for 2 grades at a time. Our teachers prepare as many as 4 different Reading plans daily based on variance of ability.
- 6. Due to the gap in ability levels, time becomes a factor as well in that it is difficult to complete daily the various groups within the classes for both Reading and Math.
- 7. Cramped classrooms encourage behavior problems causing difficulty for teachers to keep all students engaged and on task.
- 8. Due to the small classrooms, wall space is limited as is storage space and space to construct learning and activity centers. This is especially an issue in the lower grades such as kindergarten and first grade.

We have looked at prior dissertations and research indicates that overcrowded classrooms negatively affect not only students but teachers. It was reported that teachers are stressed by conditions of inadequate space, issues related to health and safety, minimal learner and teacher interaction, disruptive behaviors, increased workload, and inadequate teaching time. Research

also suggested the teacher to learner ratio relates directly to the quality of schooling. As you are aware, Akiak has made progress in both Reading and Math on state assessments and is not in need of a state coach. We contribute part of this progress to the fact that in the past we were not restricted to one teacher for two grades. In the past, Akiak has had a teacher per grade on the elementary level. In any classroom, there is diversity and learners have different needs. Our district and any quality teacher knows differentiated instruction is most important to meet the individual needs of students. Mainstream schools are required to meet the needs of special education students. As the board is aware, Akiak has been without a special education teacher for a few years. Not only is this a legal and ethical liability for the district, it is a detriment for our special students in these overcrowded classrooms. We feel that if at least one additional teacher is hired, elementary teachers will be able to provide quality teaching and learning. Smaller classrooms allow teachers to interact more with learners and give individual attention to slow learners.

As you know our LSAB meets monthly. As the principal for Akiak, I am a good point of reference to speak to any further information you might want from us. Myself and the Akiak LSAB appreciate the work of our Regional School Board. Please know that we understand you have a lot of decisions to make but hope that you will consider our recommendation about hiring an additional elementary teacher.

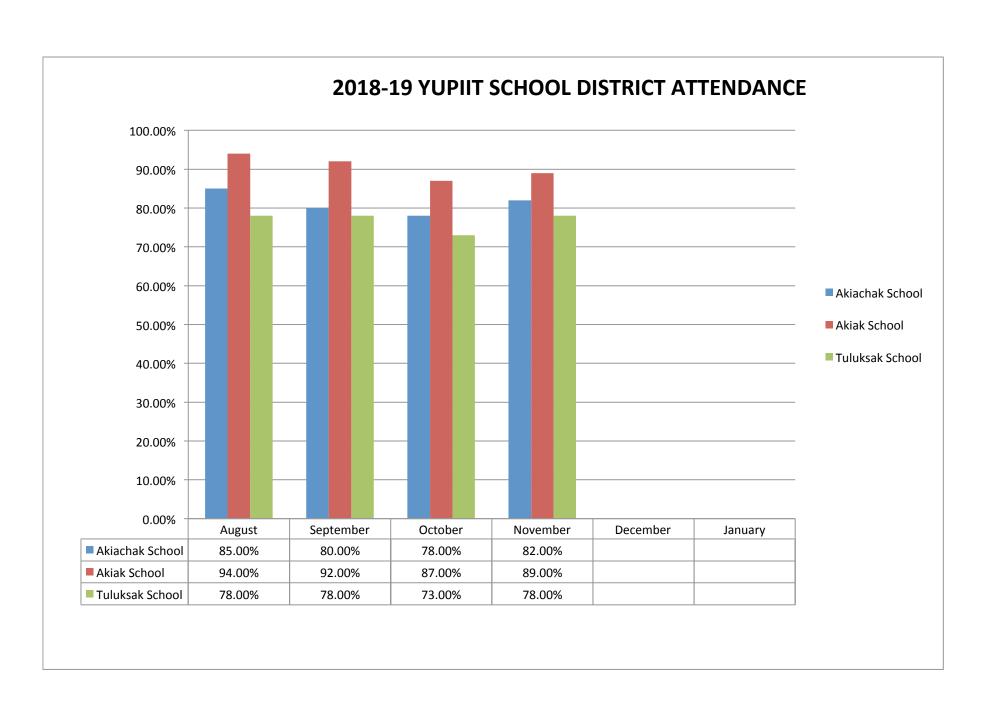
